
Meet Mrs. Schlack By David Stevenart - 6th grade

Greeters will be opening doors, greeting parishioners, and/or handing out bulletins as they enter church.

Please arrive 20 minutes before the start of Mass. Check in with an usher located in the back of church. If enough greeters have signed up, some will go to the side entrances while others remain at the main entrance. At least two people should open doors and greet parishioners while another two can ask to hand out bulletins at the main entrance. (If it is cold, please open the doors ONLY as needed!) At least one person is needed for each role at the side entrances. You may take your seat in the church when the cantor welcomes the congregation.

Gift Bearers have the honor of representing the entire parish as we return to God a small part of the many blessings that He has given to us. The unleavened Bread and Wine that you carry will be consecrated to become the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Please check in the with the ushers at least 10 minutes before Mass starts. After the Prayers of the Faithful (petitions), head to the back of the church by the gift table. An usher will help you with the gifts. You will proceed down the main aisle with the gifts after the collection (when the priest/deacon and altar servers are in place at the front of the altar).

When you arrive at the altar, present the gifts one at a time to the Priest/Deacon. <u>Stay with the group until</u> everyone has given their gift. Then, as a group, bow reverently when the priest or deacon bows, and return to your seats.

Try-outs(Assessments): March 1st, 1-2:30PM at Synergy Healthcare and Sports Facility. 350 Cimmeron Dr. East Peoria. IL

Season Consists of: Two practices a week for 2 hours, 3 local tournaments, cost is \$500. Practice will be held at Synergy Healthcare and Sports Facility and will be on Mondays and Fridays, times will be 4:30-6:30 or 6:30-8:30. Good for Friday date nights!!

8U-12U ELITE

Try-outs/Assessments: March 1st, 1-2:30PM at Synergy Healthcare and Sports Facility.

Season consists of: Two practices a week for 2 hours and 3 local tournament, 1 tournament in Aurora and 1 in Orlando. Practices will be held at Synergy on Mondays and Fridays. Practice times will be 4:30-6:30 or 6:30-8:30. Cost is \$700.
