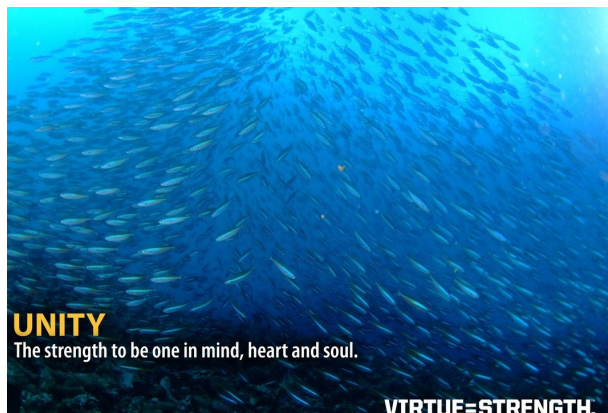


Virtue of the Week— UNITY

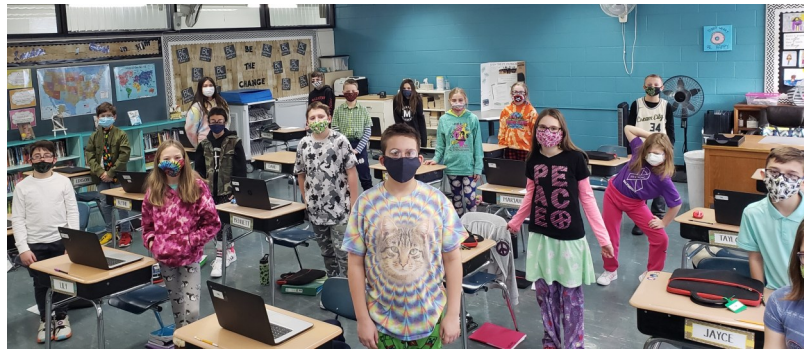

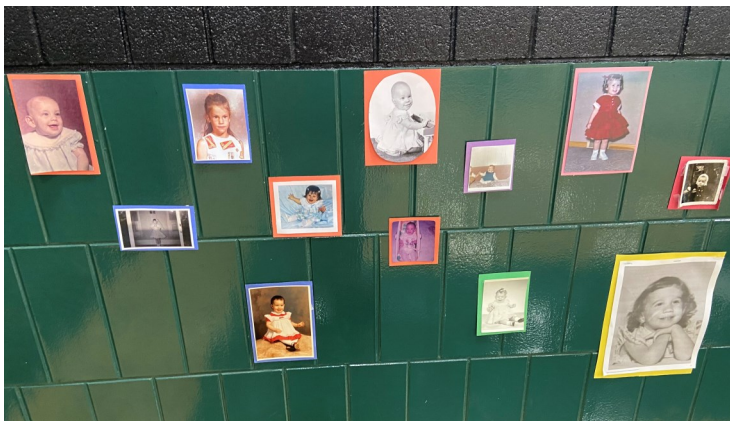

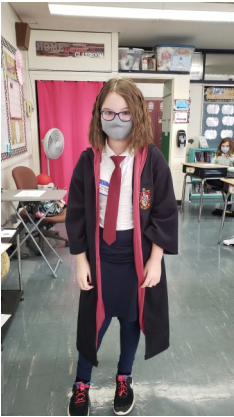
5th Grade dressed up for Mismatch Day



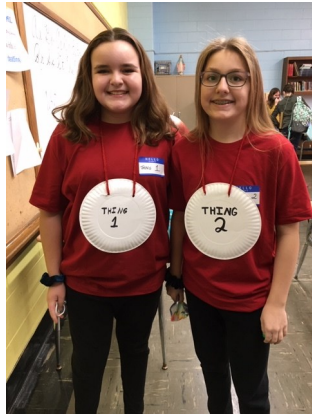
Can you tell which baby is which teacher or staff?

Celebrating the Nation

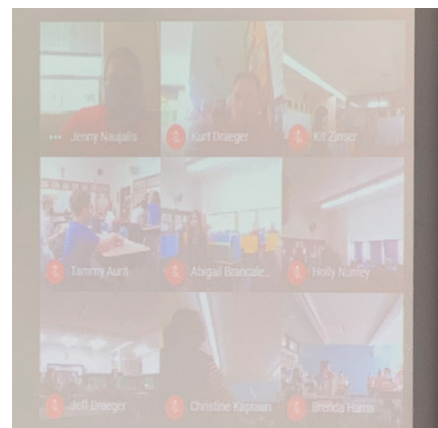
