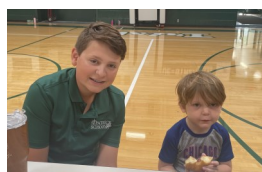

Menus are prepared for the month of September and October. You may sign up for all the lunch options at one time or you can do a week at a time. Sign up needs to be completed before 3pm on Friday of the week prior to the serve date. Please remember to sign up for each child that will be eating. Meals come with a drink. You do not need to order a milk in addition to the meal.

The cold lunch option is for office use only. This option is used if a student forgets a lunch and is given a lunchable. The student's account will be charged \$5.00 when a lunchable is given.

Please keep a credit balance on your family lunch account of more than \$5.00. If your balance gets down to \$5.00, you will receive an email on Sundays reminding you to add money to your account. You may add money by sending a check to school or through your RenWeb account.

2. Click Student - Click Lunch - Select the name of the student.
3. Click create web order - Scroll to the date of the lunch you are signing up for - Put a 1 in the quantity. **Make sure to click order items.**

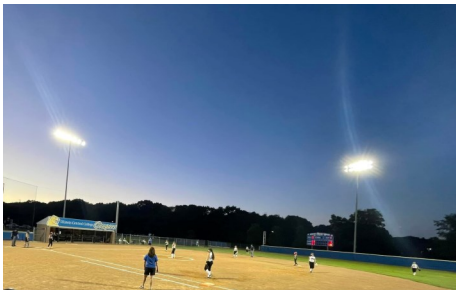
Go back to the top of the page and repeat steps 2-3 for each student.
