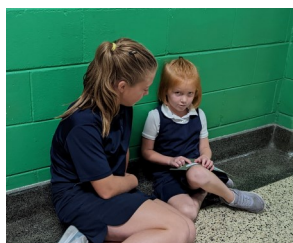
Confirmation Letters of Intention

Kindergarten & Fifth Grade Reading

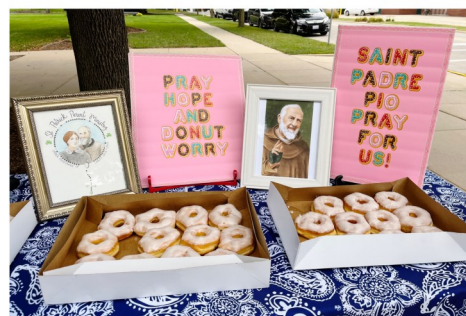
A group of fifth graders came to our classroom to listen to our kindergartners read. They also helped them with computer work afterwards.

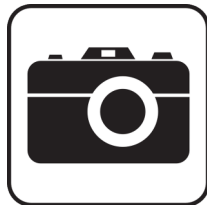

Dear Parents and Students,

The basketball season is underway and home games are beginning. The students were made aware of some reminders as we begin the season in Tuesday's morning announcements. We are asking for your help, too, in having your children and athletes follow these important reminders. These are outlined below:

- The Sisters' Religion classroom and Miss Kortz's 1st grade classroom will be used as locker rooms for teams on home game nights.
- Athletes and coaches only are allowed in these classrooms. No other student is allowed.
- Athletes are not to sit in the teachers' chairs and on desks or touch anything in the room including the Interactive boards.
- Athletes are to use these rooms only for their duffel bags and meetings with the coaches.....nothing else.
- Students are to be respectful of the teachers' classrooms otherwise you could be given an automatic detention or forfeiture of the next game.
- No students are to be in the hallways or classrooms on any floor of the school building....Students run the risk of an automatic detention or being kicked out of watching the game. They will have to call home for a ride.
- Students and spectators are allowed only in the gym, foyer, concession area, and foyer restrooms....nowhere else in the building.
- Students grades Preschool through 4th grade need to be under the supervision of a parent or guardian to be allow to come to the game. Otherwise, they will need to call home for someone to pick them up.
- Students should not be running back and forth, from the gym to the concession area or foyer during the game. You're here to watch the game. Students and spectators have time at half time and quarter endings to go to the concession stand.
- Everyone needs to take responsibility for keeping our school safe and to be respectful of other people's things in the classroom as well as the teams playing the game in the gym.

We appreciate your cooperation in helping make the games fun and enjoyable for all and for the safety of our school.
