

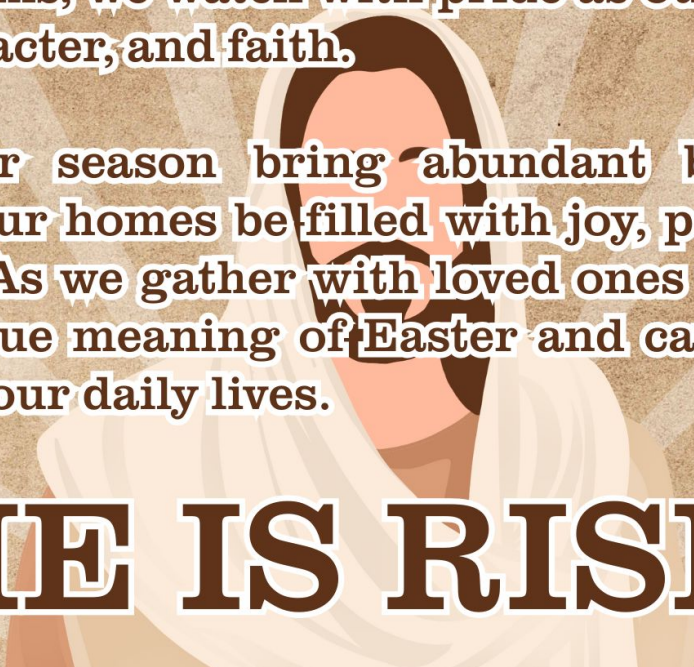

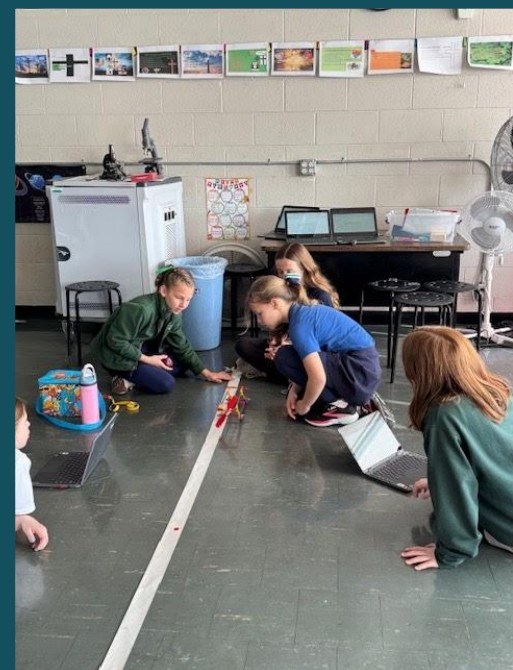
Our 7th Graders built Mouse Trap Cars during a recent Science Unit

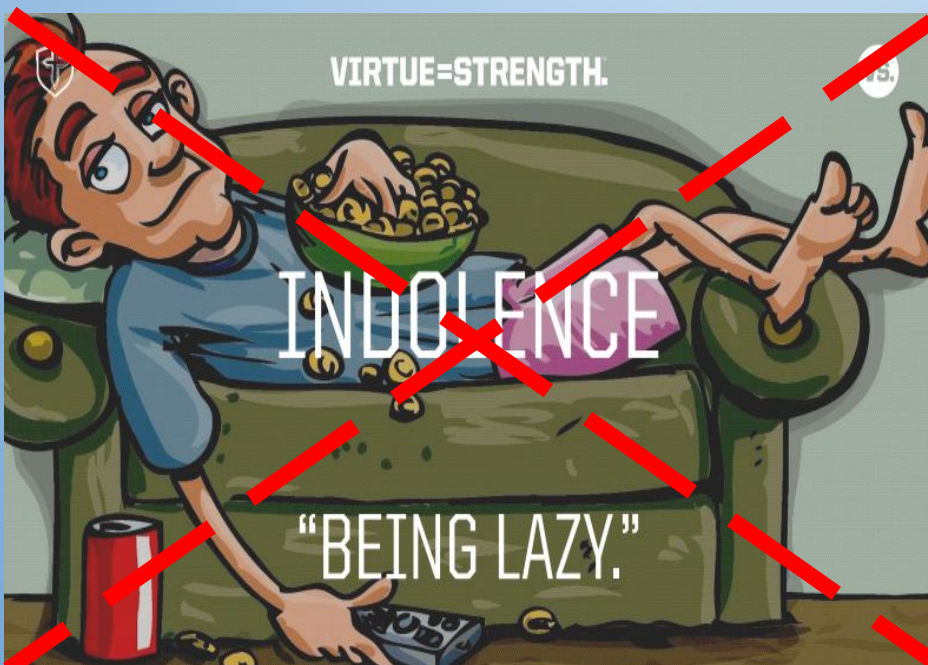

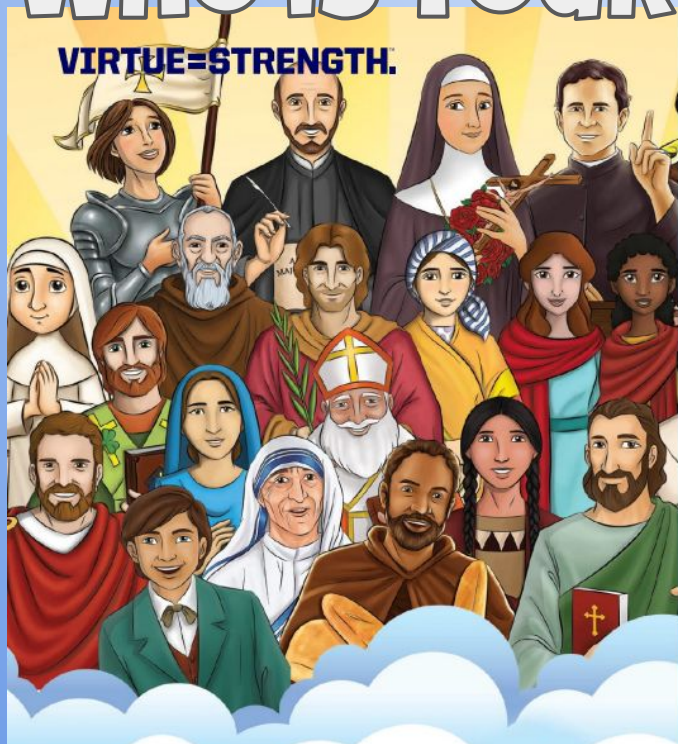

The Saints are outstanding examples of living and giving of themselves beyond the call of duty.

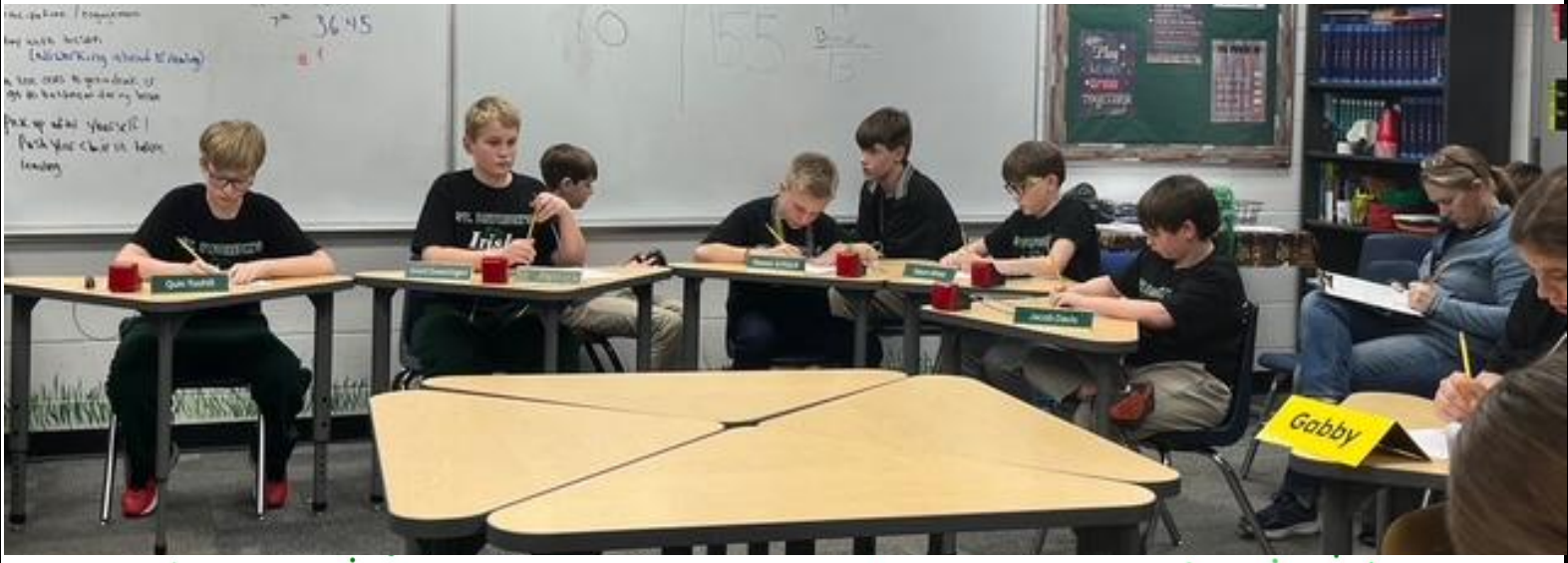
