



The Irish are the #1 seed in their Regionals. COME AND SUPPORT THE LADY IRISH as the enter the POST SEASON!!



Born to farmers in 1887 in Italy. Francesco Forgione joined the Capuchin Friars. In 1918, Fr. "Pio" received the five wounds of Our Lord's Passion (stigmata) in his body. Why Do Catholics
Do That

Why do Catholics bless themselves with holy water?

Blessing ourselves with holy water before entering a Catholic church recalls the washing rituals of the Old Testament Jews who cleansed themselves by bathing before entering the holy temple.

In addition, when we bless

ourselves with holy water, we recall
our baptism and renew our promises
to God to live our faith. Because
holy water is a sacramental, we
receive graces when we use it
with the right disposition,
such as strengthening us
against temptation and
removing venial (small) sins.
