DR. RAY GUARENDI ON DISCIPLINE :

I prefer to define discipline in a pretty straightforward, commonsense manner: to put limits and expectations upon a child's behavior, backed by consequences when necessary, in order to socialize and build character. Here is what I tell parents:

1. More than anyone else, you know what's best for your child.

2. Authority is not a bad word.

3. Discipline, by and large, is not complicated. Good ideas for administering discipline are straightforward and easy for you to use. Similar techniques can work for a wide range of problems.

4. Most importantly, parenthood is God-designed to be enjoyed. We're all in this together. We share the same worries and frustrations.

So let's lighten up, laugh more, and love our children enough to do what's best for them — and for us, too.

St. Patrick Beginning Band Info

What a crazy year! Normally, the band experience at St. Pat's begins with 4th grade students having a class learning to play recorders to learn some basic music reading skills and performing with the band students on a concert in May. Kidder Music Co. would then bring a selection of instruments to school in the fall where they demonstrate the instruments and give the kids a chance to try out on instruments they choose. Obviously, that isn't happening this year due to the virus.

So, this year we watched videos demonstrating the instruments and told the 5th graders about band at St. Pat's. The Jupiter band instrument company has developed a mouthpiece tryout kit that can be sterilized with hot soapy water after each use. We have purchased some of these kits and will use them to tryout 5th graders next Monday, Aug. 23. The music stores can no longer give tryouts on actual instruments, so we are asking the students to really think about which instrument they would like to play. Once they have decided, we will use the kit to have them try to get a sound on the mouthpiece that simulates the mouthpiece of that instrument. Percussion students tryout with drum sticks. If tryouts are successful, the next step would be for the parents to secure an instrument. Kidder Music and some other music stores in the area have rental plans available that you can check out. A representative from Kidder Music will be at St. Pat next Wednesday, Aug. 25 in the gym from 4:30 to 6:00 (walk in any time) to explain their rental and purchase plans and I will be there to answer questions about the band at St. Pat's. If you have an instrument already available to you, it would be a good idea to take it to a music store to have it checked out to make sure it is good playable condition.

We hope you will consider the benefits to being in the band and join our St. Patrick band family. Thanks for considering our program. I look forward to a great beginning band this year.
